<p>Greco-Roman and Hebrew Names for Eight Objects in our Solar System</p>	<p>“The Celestial Seven” and Earth: Associated Jewish and Messianic Meanings and Themes</p>
<p>Sun - Hebrew: <i>Shemesh</i>, Light; Chammah, Brilliance; Charshah, Heat</p>	<p>Purity, Fairness, and Judgment of God, Wisdom (enlightenment) given by God, the power and presence of God in nature</p>
<p>Moon - Hebrew: <i>Levanah</i>, White</p>	<p>Israel’s Spiritual renewal, God’s reflection in the Messiah</p>
<p>Mercury - Hebrew: <i>Kohav</i>, Sun Planet; Chammah, to Burn or Sparkle</p>	<p>A scribe or attendant on the Sun; a herald of God’s decrees and recorder of God’s judgments</p>
<p>Venus - Hebrew: <i>Nogah</i>, Brightness, Illumination, Splendor</p>	<p>The Messiah as the bright Morning Star; trusting in God, who gives light and guides our path</p>
<p>Earth - Hebrew: <i>Eretz</i>, Land, Soil, Flesh</p>	<p>Considered Center of the Universe, Home to Yahshua & Mankind</p>
<p>Mars - Hebrew: <i>M’adim</i>, Blood color or blood strength</p>	<p>Blood atonement, blood sacrifice; God’s judgment against sin and the death and destruction caused by it.</p>
<p>Jupiter - Hebrew: <i>Tzedeq</i>, Righteousness</p>	<p>Planet of the Messiah; symbol of God’s righteous representative</p>
<p>Saturn - Hebrew: <i>Shabbatai</i>, the Sabbath</p>	<p>The Sabbath rest; ceasing work to contemplate God’s greatness and praise God for His goodness; redemption and blessing</p>
